The key to the code is that the first two numbers in each set refer to the page number. The second two numbers refer to the line number (ignore jokes, headings, and spaces) and the last two letters refer to the word number on that line. For example, the code above would make the message "You are a dear friend". See if you can work out the secret coded message below - using the Tarpeena's Pages as the key.

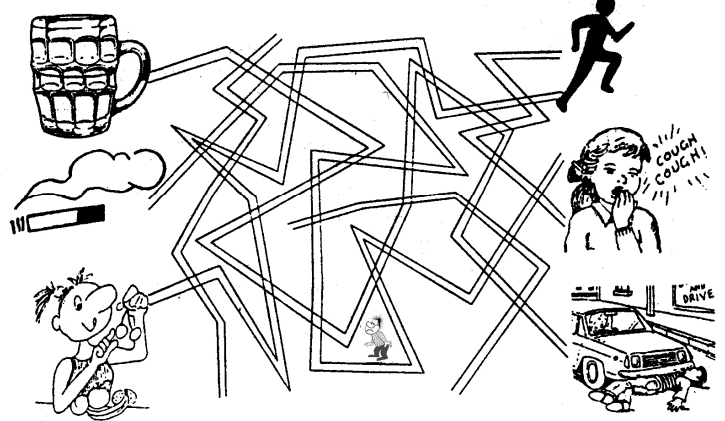

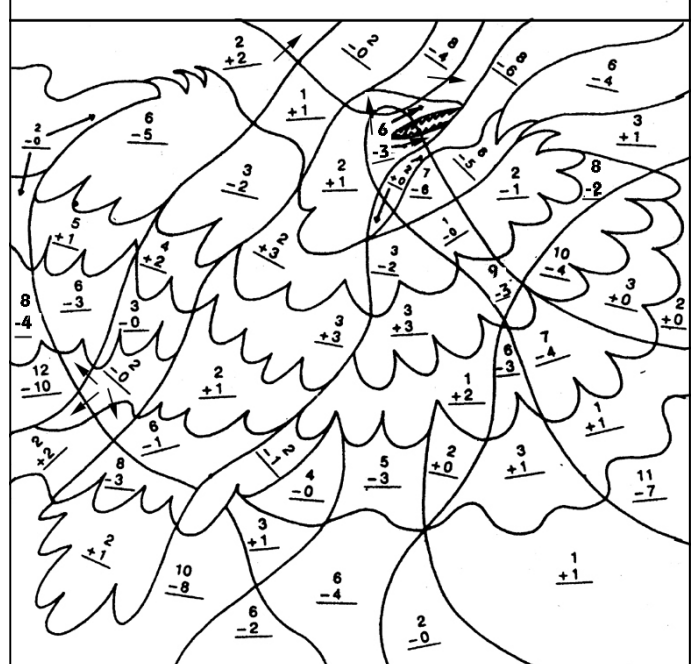

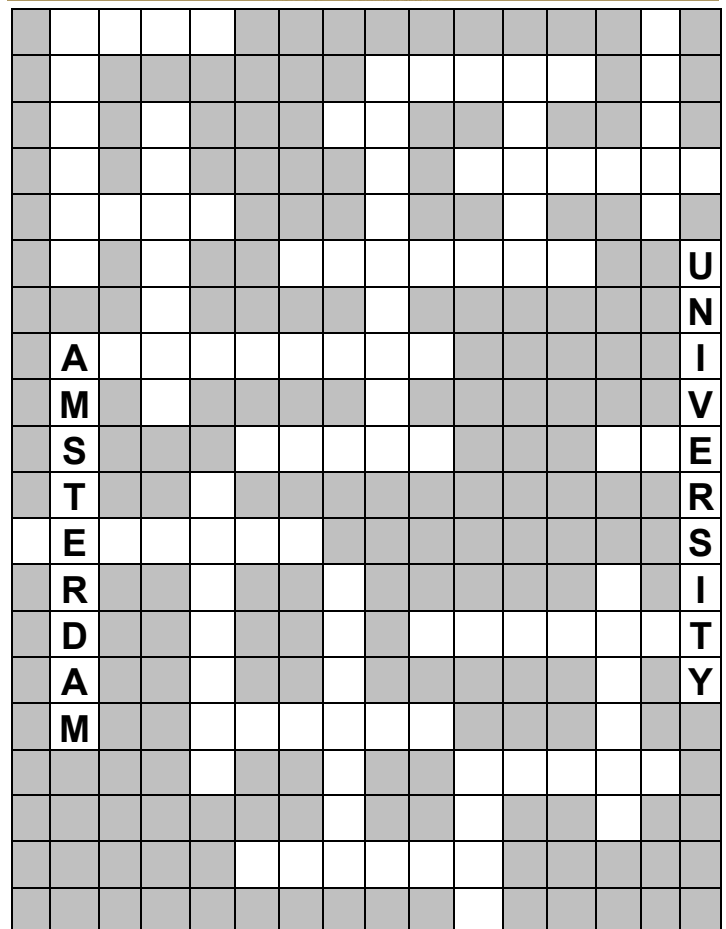
A recent study by the University of Amsterdam has shown that even small doses of Ecstasy by first time users caused brain damage because blood flow to the brain was reduced and this affected their memory.

Ecstasy is one of the major illicit drugs used at clubs and hotels in Australia so the brain damage even to first time users is disturbing. Other studies have shown that long term and heavy use of Ecstasy (MDMA) can damage neurons and cause depression, anxiety, confusion, sleep difficulty and memory problems.

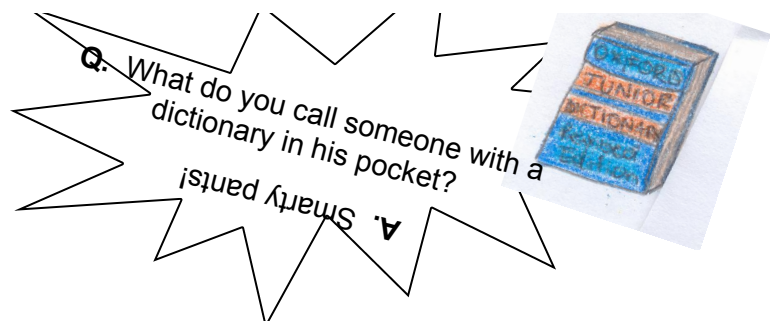
The United Nations Office of Drug Control has reported that Australia has the highest use of Ecstasy per capita in the world—many of those using are young people. This means that the risk of brain damage for young people is very high.

Do not destroy your brain—you only get one! Say "No!" to drugs. Protect your memory and be wise!

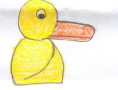

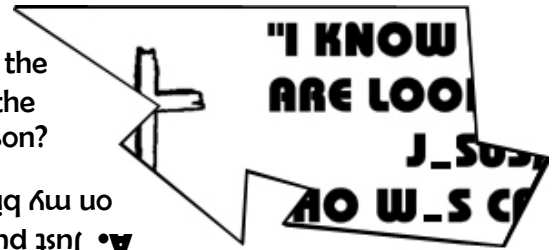
