Use the first letters of the children’s names in the story in the order they are mentioned, to find a hidden message.

# PARTY DRUGS!

## CANNABIS, ECSTASY & GHB

Some **drugs** are used at events where there is often **dancing** and **music**. They are called "**party**" drugs. They seem **attractive** because they cause a person to feel **pleasure**. Young people are **tempted** to try them to have **fun**. This is a trap - in the same way that cheese looks nice to mice on a mousetrap, but only leads to death. **Drinks** can be **spiked** with **GHB**, which is sometimes called **Grievous Bodily Harm**. GHB causes the messages from the **brain** to the body to slow down so a person feels relaxed and does not think well and suffers some **memory** loss. Girls may be attacked and their lives ruined while they are not able to think clearly. **Cannabis** and **Ecstasy** pills are also used at parties. Some **deaths** have occurred because of taking drugs at these events. True **happiness** comes from making right choices and helping others. Choosing to **abstain** from drugs and say 'No' is the best way to live life to the full. Don't be trapped by the offer of short-term pleasure!



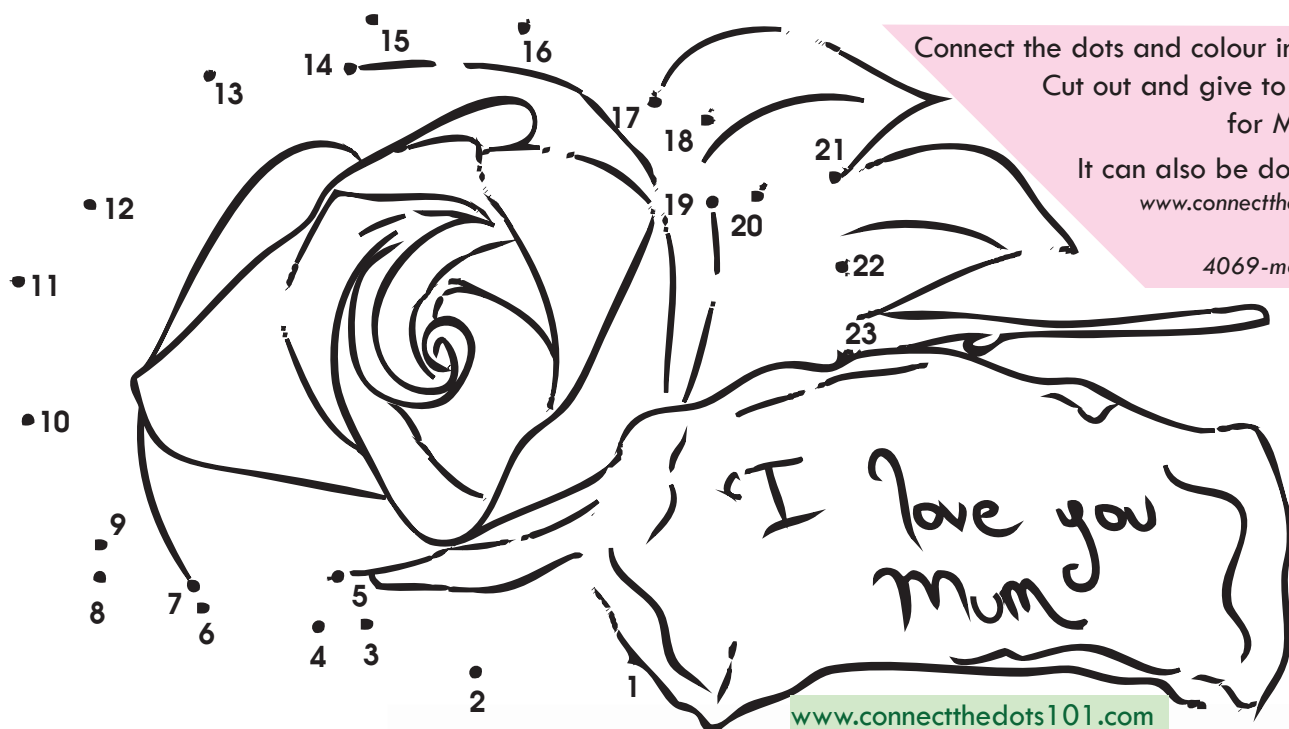

It takes 74 litres of water to make one

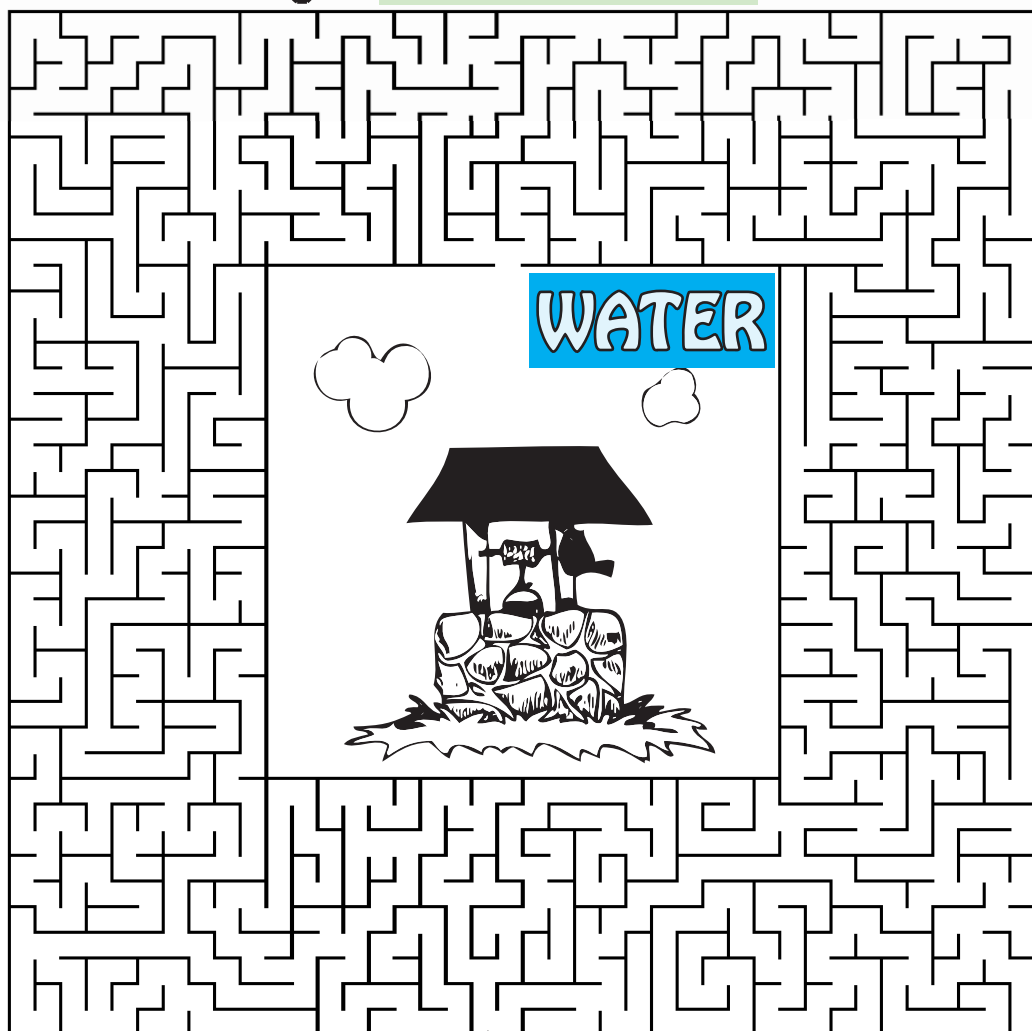


standard glass of beer. Choose to protect our resources by
